Federal Resources

- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) assistance is now available to Pinellas and Hillsborough County residents who experienced damages/losses due to Hurricane Helene. Disaster assistance may include financial help for temporary lodging, basic home repairs and other disaster-caused expenses. Eligible residents can apply online at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.disasterassistance.gov), using the FEMA app or by phone at 1-800-621-FEMA (3362). <https://www.disasterassistance.gov/>

Disaster Unemployment Assistance

- If you lost your job or had a break in your employment, self-employment, or business as a direct result of Hurricane Helene, you might be able to get benefit money from DUA. Work search reporting, waiting week, and Employ Florida registration requirements for Reemployment Assistance claims have been temporarily waived for Floridians impacted by Hurricane Helene in FEMA disaster-declared counties.

SNAP Food Replacement

Business Resources

- Complete the Business Damage Assessment Survey offered by FloridaCommerce. Survey responses will allow the state to expedite the storm recovery efforts by gathering and assessing the needs of affected businesses. Select the named storm from the dropdown menu. No need to know the exact

dollar value of your costs, an estimate is fine.

Pinellas County Resources

- FEMA will open a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) at Largo Public Library, 120 Central Park Drive, Largo, to assist residents affected by Hurricane Helene on Wednesday, Oct. 2. The DRC will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Wednesday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday and Friday and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday. - Crisis Cleanup has activated the Hurricane Helene Cleanup Hotline: (844) 965-1386. This is for people who need help cleaning up damage from the Hurricane Helene and connects people with volunteers from local relief organizations, community groups and faith communities who may be able assist with jobs such as muck-outs (cleaning up), trees, tarp, and debris. All services are free, but service is not guaranteed. This hotline will remain open through Friday, Oct. 11, 2024.

- **Damage Reporting:** The Hurricane Helene Damage Reporting Form is designed to help Hillsborough County officials connect residents with local recovery resources.

Homeowners and owners/renters of agricultural properties, nonprofits, and houses of worship should complete this form, which will help County staff communicate resident needs to local partners, such as American Red Cross, Feeding Tampa Bay, Metropolitan Ministries, Rebuilding Together Tampa Bay, and more. Residents who need assistance in completing the form should call (833) HC-STORM or 833-427-8676, the County's Customer Service & Support storm information line. This County assessment form IS NOT a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) application. To register with FEMA, visit

DisasterAssistance.gov. Please keep in mind that completing this form DOES NOT replace a business or homeowner's insurance claim, nor does it serve as an application for resources.

- **Hillsborough County Comfort Stations:** Hillsborough County and the City of Tampa opened six comfort stations to help residents affected by Hurricane Helene. Two comfort stations are in the City of Tampa and four other locations are in Town 'N Country, Apollo Beach, and Ruskin.

The comfort stations offer showers, restrooms, ice, washers, and dryers for laundry, and charging stations for phones, laptops, and other communications devices. Hot food or boxed meals will be available from approximately 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. for lunch and 5:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. for dinner.

- **Storm debris cleanup:** Hillsborough County will be collecting storm debris from County neighborhoods most heavily affected by Hurricane Helene. Residents in the County's collection areas impacted by flooding should place debris curbside without blocking the roadway or storm drains. To ensure smooth collection, materials should be separated into three categories: yard waste, damaged household appliances, and construction and demolition debris to include furniture, drywall, carpet, and fencing. Bagged waste and household hazardous waste, such as paint or car batteries, will not be accepted as part of this storm-related pickup. To learn more, visit the [pickup map](#).
- **Hurricane Helene Agricultural Impacts Survey Available:** The University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/IFAS) is conducting a survey to determine agricultural damages from Hurricane Helene. Survey results will be used to estimate production losses and inform local, state, and federal decision-making related to disaster declaration, response, and relief.
